Long committed to public service, he was elected to the Zanesville City Council shortly after college graduation and, at the age of 26, was elected mayor of the city of Zanesville, where he oversaw natural gas and cable negotiations, water and sewer infrastructure development and other public works projects. Mr. Mason is a Rotarian with 31 years of perfect attendance and is a multiple Paul Harris Fellow. He is also a 32nd degree Mason, Shriner, and a member of the several other Masonic organizations and the Knights of Columbus. He continues to serve Muskingum County as trustee and past president of the Muskingum County Library System. He is in his 33rd year as an Ohio wrestling official and has been was selected to referee the Ohio High School State Wrestling Championships multiple times.
