For your convenience, below is a summary of convention events each day:

- **Monday**: The RNC Rules Committee meets to finalize convention rules.
- **Tuesday**: A roll call of each state will take place as they announce their nomination for Presidential and Vice-Presidential Candidates; because Ohio Governor John Kasich won the Presidential Primary in Ohio, all Ohio delegates are expected to vote for him during the first round of state voting. However, Ohio's delegates are allowed to vote for another Presidential Candidate in any subsequent rounds of voting.
- Wednesday: The Vice Presidential Candidate, Indiana Governor Mike Pence, speaks at 7 p.m.
- **Thursday**: The likely Republican Presidential Nominee, Donald Trump, closes out the convention with a speech beginning at 7:30 p.m.
